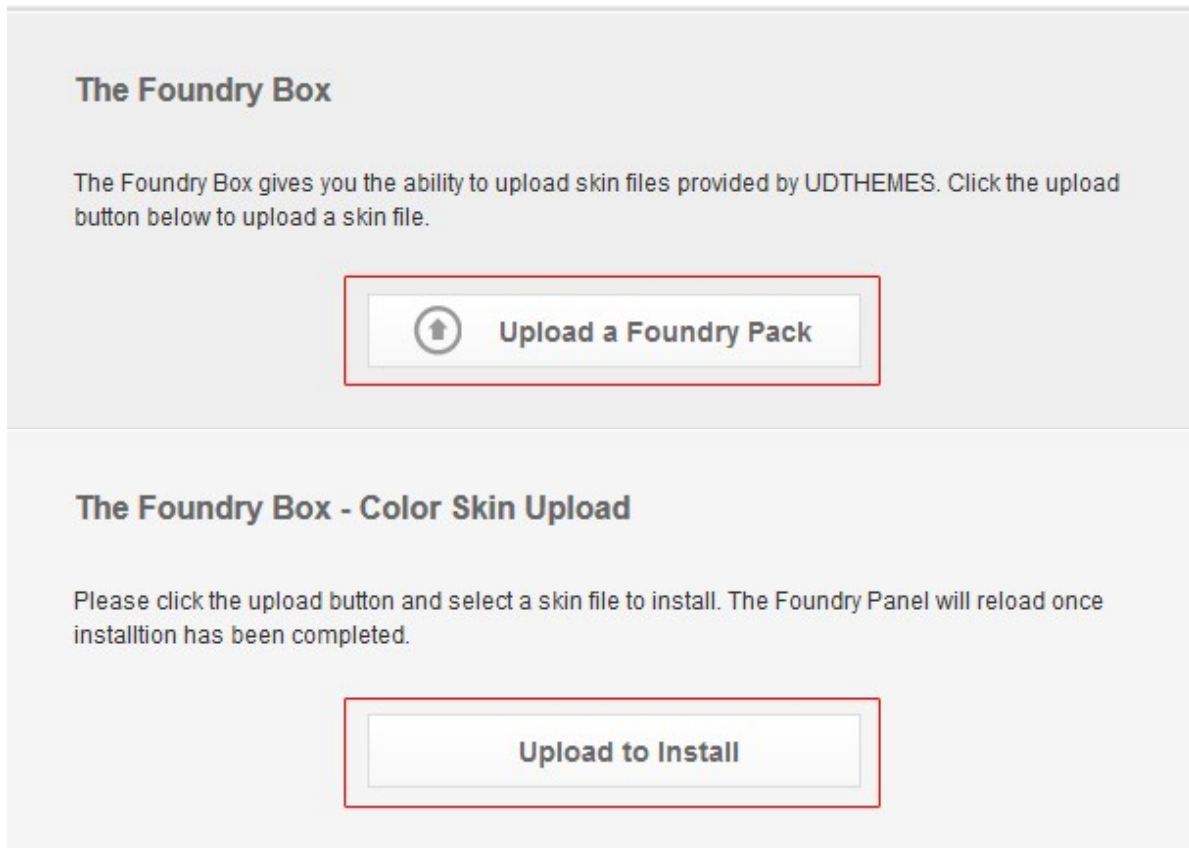
Installation

Note: There are two methods of theme installation. Normally you should be able to install your theme through the Appearance menu of the WordPress dashboard, but you might occasionally have to install the theme manually by using FTP.

Please [click here](#) for instruction on how to install a theme through the WordPress Admin or via FTP.

Installing a Skin

Three skins are provided with Ego WP (dark, light and variated). They are installed by going 'The Foundry' > "Welcome". In the welcome screen click 'Upload a Foundry Pack' and thereafter 'Upload to Install'.



Demo Content

To help you get going we have included a demo content file that will create the homepage sections, pages and posts you see in the demo. The file can be installed by going Tools > Import.

Whether you have installed the demo content or started from scratch you will need to follow these steps:

Set Front Page Display

Click Settings > Reading. Under Front Page Display select 'A static page (select below)'. Select 'Home' for frontpage and 'Blog' as for post page as seen below.

Set Custom Menu

Under Theme Location select 'main menu'

Click 'Save Menu' under your newly created menu.

Step.4

If you have imported the demo content your menu will already consist of custom links. If you are doing this from scratch you will need to create custom links that links to sections in your onepage. This is done as follows:

Note: for sections we enter the full URL and then end it with the section we want to link to perceded by hashbang (i.e.#about). To link to an external page we simply enter the direct URL. Keep in mind that if you have named your page i.e. 'About the Team', it would be entered as #about-the-team, each word separated by a hyphen.

The slug for each section can be found by clicking 'Quick Edit' in the Homepage Sections Index as seen below:

Updating Ego

IMPORTANT NOTE:** Following these steps will ensure that your data stays intact. However, if you have made any CSS changes to the theme, please make sure that they have been entered directly in the Foundry CSS Editor or in an external stylesheet imported in the Foundry CSS Editor . **Any changes to template files will be overwritten in an update.

Step 1. Delete Current Version

Go Appearance > Themes. Activate one of the default themes that comes with WordPress. Then click the 'Delete' link under your uploaded theme.

Step 2. Upload the New Version

Go Appearance > Themes. Click 'Install Themes' > 'Upload' and select your the theme folder. Once uploaded click 'Activate'.

Importing a Stylesheet

You can import a stylesheet in the Foundry CSS Editor as follow:

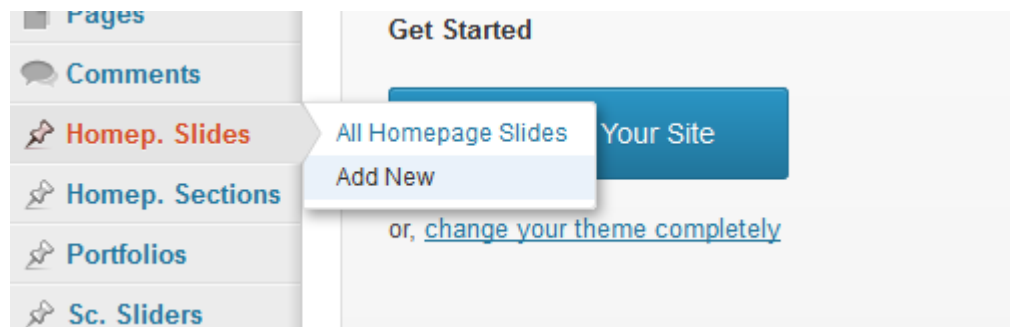
Slider Image Sizes

Images used in the slider will automatically scale to fit the viewport. Images used for the demo are approximately 1500px * 1000px in size and around 200kb each. Note that all slides should be the same size.

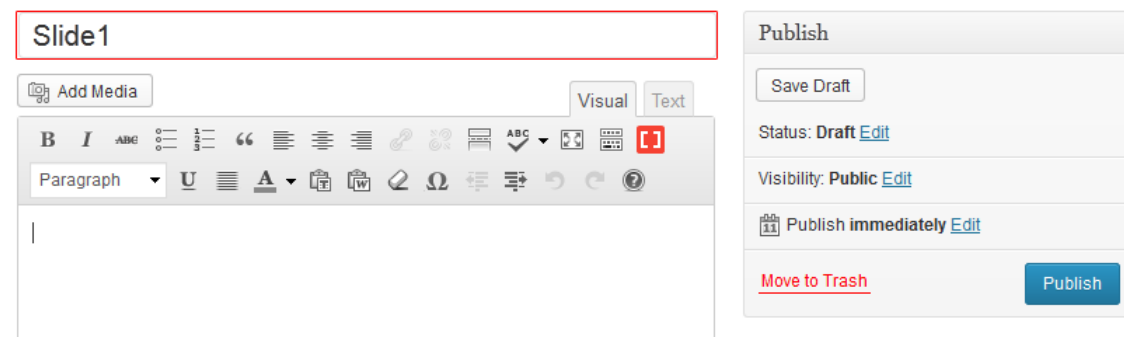

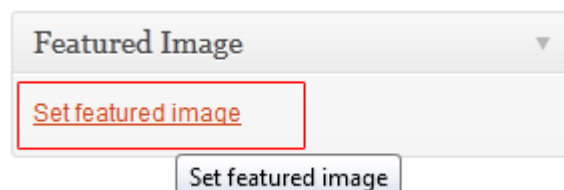

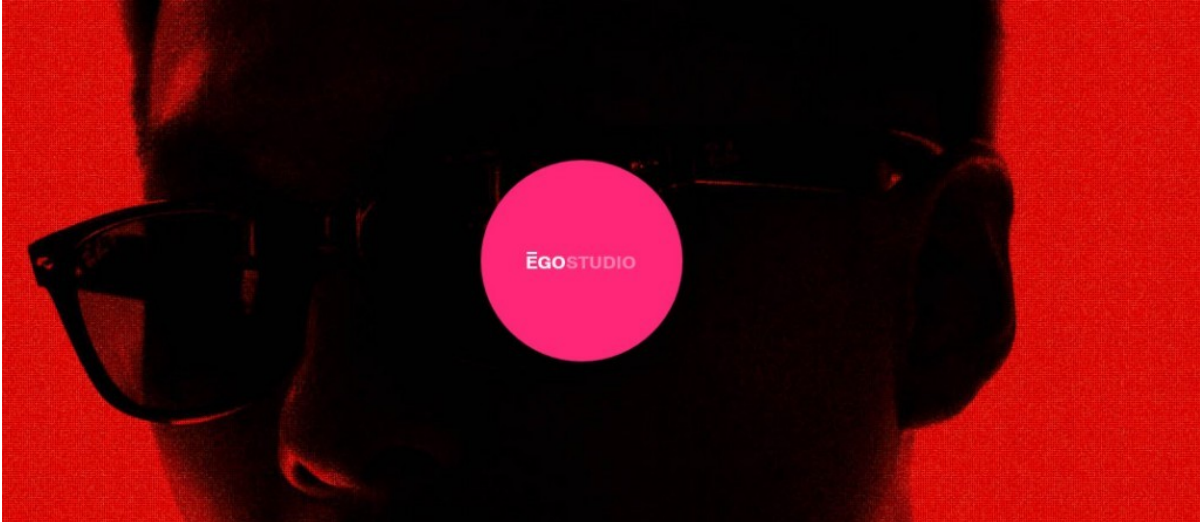

Select 'Logo' from the 'Slider Options' as indicated in Step.4 under 'Adding Slides'

Step.2 Construct

For the logo to appear you do not enter anything in the editor. If you want to link the homepage logo to a page or section, simply create a link.

Step.3 Linking

Highlight your text and click the link icon in the editor. In the modal window that opens enter the url or section to which you want to link. Note: For section keep in mind to enter section ID preceded by hashbang at the end of the url. For example:

Increasing Circle Size


If your logo is larger than the slider circle, you can increase it by going Foundry > CSS Editor and enter the following:

```
.epic-logo {width:yourWidth, height:yourHeight}
```

Note: you will not need to set any negative margins as this is calculated by the script.



Adding Slider Captions

There are four types of captions, namely:

1. Impact (centered caption)
2. Striped
3. Boxed
4. Elegant

Constructing an Impact Caption



Step 1. Caption Style

Select 'Image' from the 'Slider Options' as indicated in Step.4 under 'Adding Slides'

Step 2. Construct

The impact caption is created using the span shortcode as follows:

```
[span]Caption[/span]
```

By default, wrapping a word or full caption in the span shortcode will use the default font family and font size of the theme, which is set in the Foundry Theme Options Panel. You can control the font family and size by passing the following classes to the span shortcode:

1. font_variation (sets a font variation which is set in the Foundry Theme Options Panel)
2. size_1 through size_6 (variates font size, also set in the Foundry Theme Options Panel)

These classes are added as follows:

```
[span class="size_1 font_variation"]Caption[/span]
```

Example

As such we can construct a full caption as follows.

Constructing a Striped Caption



Step 1. Caption Style

Select 'Striped Top Left' or 'Striped Top Right' or 'Striped Bottom Left' or 'Striped Bottom Right' from the 'Slider Options' as indicated in Step.4 under 'Adding Slides'

Step 2. Construct

The striped caption is created just like the Impact caption, using the span shortcode as follows:

```
[span]Caption[/span]
```

As with the Impact caption, you can control the font family and size by passing the following classes to the span shortcode:

1. font_vartion (sets a font vartion which is set in the Foundry Theme Options Panel)
2. size_1 through size_6 (variates font size, also set in the Foundry Theme Options Panel)

These classes are added as follows:

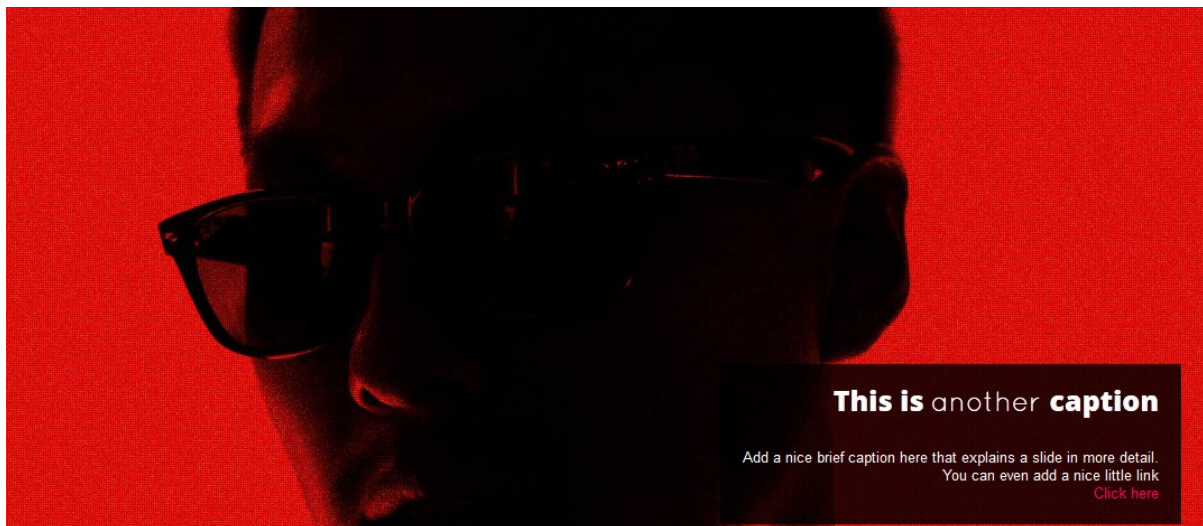

Constructing a Boxed Caption



Step 1. Caption Style

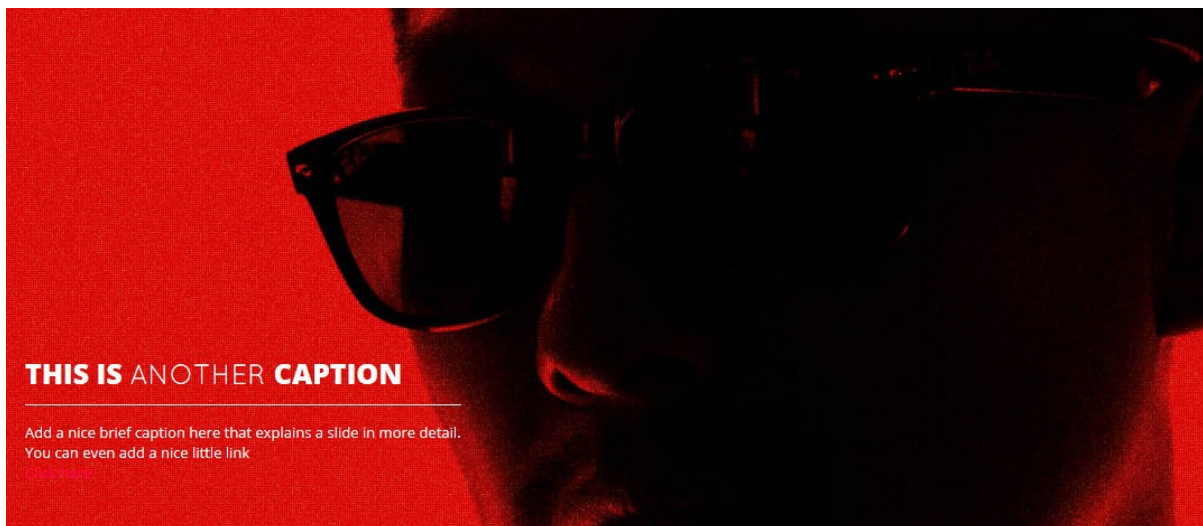
Select 'Boxed Top Left' or 'Boxed Top Right' or 'Boxed Bottom Left' or 'Boxed Bottom Right' from the 'Slider Options' as indicated in Step.4 under 'Adding Slides'

Step 2. Construct

Unlike the Impact and Striped caption, Boxed caption only uses the span shortcode for font variation of the title, and is constructed as follows

Constructing a Elegant Caption



Step 1. Caption Style

Select 'Elegant Top Left' or 'Elegant Top Right' or 'Elegant Bottom Left' or 'Elegant Bottom Right' from the 'Slider Options' as indicated in Step.4 under 'Adding Slides'

Step 2. Construct

Like boxed caption, elegant caption only uses the span shortcode for font variation of the title, and is constructed as follows



Homepage Sections

Homepage Section Layouts

The theme comes with three homepage section layouts, namely:

- Default (regular page)
- Portfolio (loads projects)
- Contact (loads contact form)

Note: You can use as many default homepage sections layouts as necessary, but only one Portfolio and one Contact section layout. Each layout can take additional content which can be styled with shortcodes. Each section also comes with its own teaser area (with parallax background image) that also can be styled with shortcodes.

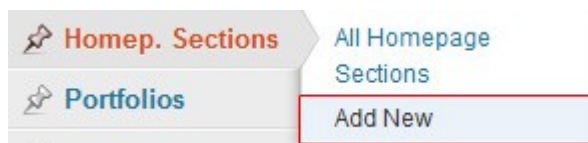
Sidebars

The contact layout is the only homepage section that can have a sidebar. You can add widgets to this sidebar under by going Appearance > Widgets.

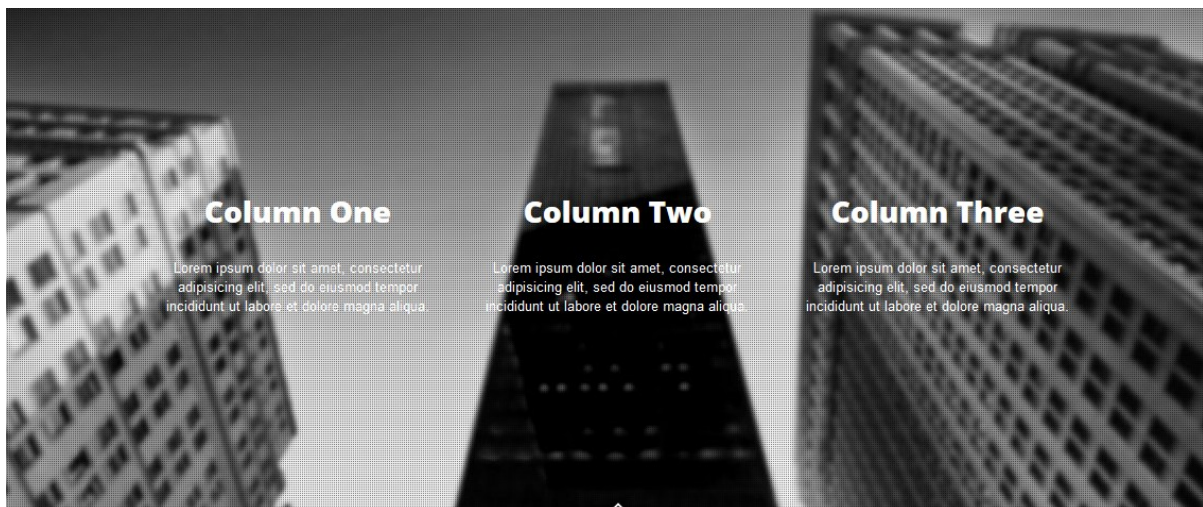
The teaser areas can be styled using a variety of shortcodes, keep in mind though that it is only 480px in height and therefore is suitable only for brief content. The image size for the teaser area are : 1600x800px. The following elements are supported:

1. Columns
2. Buttons
3. Blockquotes
4. Images
5. Lightboxes
6. Sliders
7. Video
8. Twitter ticker
9. Social Icons
- 10.HTML

Below are a few samples on how to style the teaser areas using the above mentioned shortcodes:

Columns

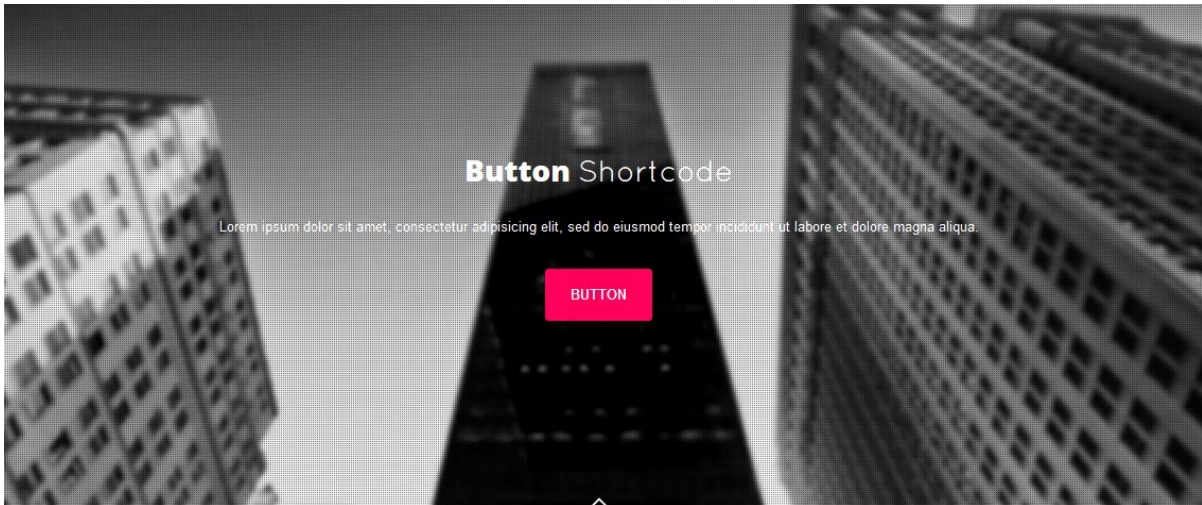

For inserting an image we use the image shortcode. Keep in mind to set a fixed width and height (recommended max height is 382px). To center an image we add a custom style by entering 'margin:0 auto 0 auto;' as shown below:

1. Default (width:600px)
2. Full Width (width:930px)

You will now see your uploaded image. To create a Featured Slider scroll down to 'Display Opt' and select set as 'Display Featured Slider'. Note that you will have to do this for each slide you want to add to the slider.



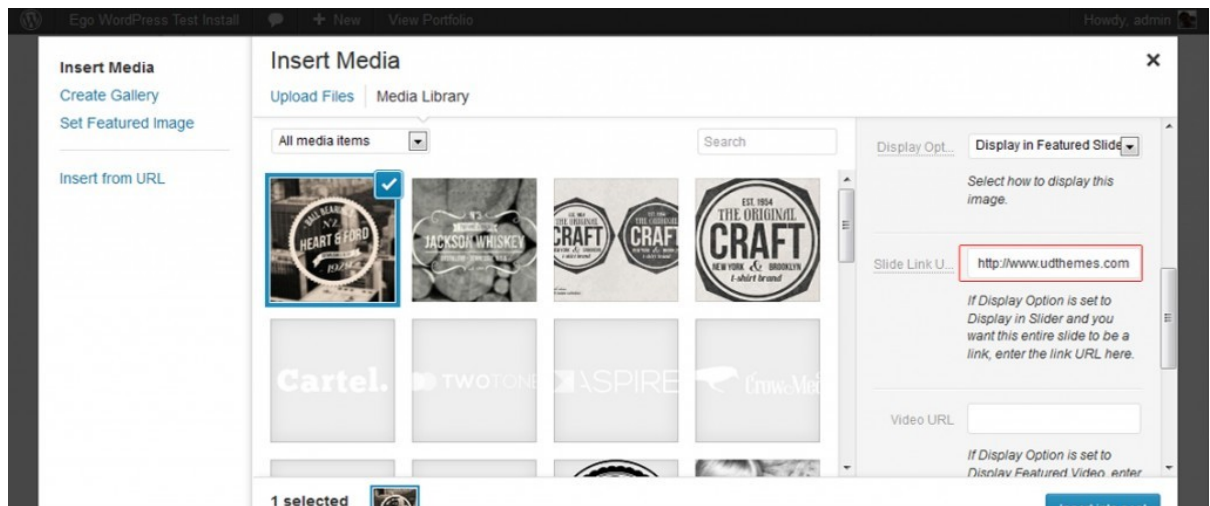
Step.4

Add a caption to you slide. Scroll to 'Caption' and enter a brief caption for your slide.



Step.5

Add a slide link. Scroll to 'Slide Link URL' and enter your URL.



Step.6

Repeat steps 3 to 5 for each slide you want to add to the slider. Keep in mind that you will need to have added two or more slides to activate the slider. Once done, close the modal and click on 'Publish'
